

2011 STACK UP! Guinness World Record

On Thursday, November 17th, Big Hollow students in grades 2, 3 and 4 participated in the “World’s Largest Sport Stacking Event.” During the course of the Guinness World Record Day, sport stackers from all reaches of the world were up stacking and down stacking various pyramids in prescribed patterns at lightning speed for at least 30 minutes throughout the day. The goal was to have 350,000 stackers participate on this day. Big Hollow signed up to help reach this record by having 600 students stack during their Physical Education class.

Every Step Counts

Big Hollow’s third graders are participating in an exciting program called “Every Step Counts” which encourages the students to be active throughout the day. The program runs from November 14th through April 30th. Students were issued pedometers to count their steps and instructed on how to record their steps on the LogIt website. The website keeps track of the individual progress as well as the progress of each class as they travel around the United States from state capital to state capital. Students receive different colored wristbands as they achieve set milestones. The class that walks the farthest will also receive t-shirts. The elementary physical education department was awarded the Trustmark Impact Grant that will assist in covering some of the cost of this program.
