REGISTRATION

Registration

Registration is open. Registration deadline for Academics/ESY is Friday, May 18, 2018.

There will be no registration on the 1st day of summer school.

Registration Confirmation

A registration confirmation letter will be sent when your registration has been received and processed. A final schedule will be sent out the week before summer school starts.

Class Limits/Cancellations

Class registration has begun. Early enrollment is important as classes are cancelled before the opening of summer school if there is insufficient registration. Should a class not reach the minimum number of students, a cancellation notice will be sent to parents with the opportunity to sign up for a different course. The goal is to provide opportunities to as many students as possible.



Tuition/Scholarship

Tuition is based on the number of classes your child is registered to attend, please include your tuition payment with your registration. Limited scholarships are available based on need with preference for academic courses.

Transportation

Reading and Math with P.E. Games (\$50)

June 4- June 14 *or* June 18- June 28
Kindergarten-2nd

How about some fun games to strengthen letter, sounds, and word skills? Does playing P.E. games and Math activities go together? They do this summer in Reading Math and P.E. games! Come join us! We will be the group having fun outside on the playground and in the gym while practicing our reading and math skills.

Fun with Math and Reading! (\$50)

June 4- June 14 *or* June 18- June 28
Kindergarten-2nd

Have fun and retain math and reading skills during the summer in this exciting class! Learn and practice math through games and hands-on activities. Read hilarious and exciting fiction, interesting non-fiction, and practice reading with readers theaters and reading games. Students of all ability levels will be accommodated through differentiated instruction. Take this class for two weeks, or come for all four!

Read and Craft (\$50.00)

June 4- June 14 or June 18- June 28
1st-3rd

Strengthen reading skills, complete crafts to go along with stories.

Creative Writing (\$100)

June 4- June 28
6th-8th

This course is designed for students who want to create their own original stories--whether it's in the form of poetry, short fiction, film, memoir, graphic novel, speech, drama--or anything else you can think of! In Creative Writing, students will explore the power of storytelling as they create, refine, and share their own, unique narrative creations in a collaborate and fun environment.

STEM (\$50)

June 4- June 14 or June 18- June 28
5th-8th

This enrichment opportunity will include participating in integrated hands-on science, technology, and engineering projects. Projects may include engineering and building models, working with Spheros and Lego Robots, utilizing 3D printers and accompanying software, as well as working with a Makey-Makey Circuit to create one of a kind projects!

Centered Creative Writing (\$50)

June 18- June 28 (only)
3rd-7th

Get your brain ready and centered for creative writing with yoga and mindfulness. Each class will begin with yoga exercises, breathing and/ or mindfulness techniques. The rest of the class will be focused on creative writing, finished with group discussion and sharing. Students will be dismissed with an inspirational quote or challenge for the day.

Fun with Graphic Novels (\$50)

June 4- June 14 or June 18- June 28
4th-6th

Students will be reading graphic novels and working on reading skills and strategies. We will also be incorporating creative writing into the course.

Team Sports (\$50)

June 4- June 14 or June 18- June 28
6th-8th

This course is for incoming 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students interested in being physically active and having fun! We will play team sports and games such as Capture the Flag, Ultimate Frisbee, and Kickball. Students in this course will practice working together as a team, utilizing their social skills, and will increase their physical fitness.

A Wrinkle in Time and Beyond! (\$100)

June 4- June 28
5th-6th

Students will be reading and exploring the themes in A Wrinkle in Time by Madeleine L'Engle. Students will be using activities in the performing arts, visual arts, and literary arts to create experiences that will immerse themselves in the story. These experiences will enhance fluency, comprehensions and critical thinking skills.

Blast off to 1st Grade! (\$50)

June 4- June 14
Kindergarten

This class is intended review skills taught in kindergarten and help your child prepare for the transition into first grade. These skills will be reinforced through a variety of hands-on materials and games.



TRANSITION CAMP INCOMING 5th GRADERS

Transition Camp

Students entering 5th grade in the 2018-2019 are invited to participate in 5th grade Transition Camp at Big Hollow Middle School. The Transition Camp will be held from August 14, 2018 through August 16, 2018. Classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 11:30 a.m.

Purpose:

The purpose of the 5th Grade Transition Camp is to allow incoming 5th grade students to participate in fun filled activities while getting acclimated to the Middle School prior to the start of school.

Objectives:

- Learn Middle School expectations
- Provide opportunities to students to practice their schedule
- Introduce technology resources to their future learning
- Enhance social/emotional opportunities to establish new peer relationships through fun activities and games.

Cost:

The cost of the Transition Camp will be \$25.00 which includes transportation.



EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR

Extended School Year (ESY)

The District ESY program will be held from June 4, 2018 through June 28, 2018. No classes will be offered on Friday. Classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 11:00 a.m. ESY is recommended for individual students by the IEP team and is offered at no cost to the family.

Purpose:

The purpose of the Extended School Year (ESY) program is to reduce recoupment time needed for students with disabilities who show evidence of regression in performance in a subject matter area or who have demonstrated limited recoupment capabilities during a break in instruction. ESY services are generally considered an integral part of programming for some students with disabilities.

Objectives:

- Reduce the recoupment time needed for students with disabilities to maintain the skills they had as they are promoted to the next grade level.
- Improve the success rate of these students in retaining and applying rigorous learning skills.
- Support the student's individual rate and way of learning to attain their goals as stated on the IEP.
- Maintain compliance with ISBE Rules and Regulations that govern Special Education.

Cost:

Extended School Year is at no cost to the family.
